


AAA Uganda Office Activities

AAA Uganda Office operates two main projects: Child Sponsorship and Micro-Credit. These initiatives aim to support vulnerable children's education and empower local communities economically.



Child Sponsorship Project Overview



Child Sponsorship Activities

1 Needs Assessment

Coordinator conducts assessments with local authorities and school leaders.

School Visits

Monitor academic performance and wellbeing, conducted once per term.

3 Home Visits

Evaluate beneficiaries' home environment during holidays.

4 Quarterly Meetings

Discuss children's wellbeing with parents/guardians and beneficiaries.



Child Sponsorship Support

Scholastic Materials

Distribute books, pens, shoes, bags, and toiletries to beneficiaries.

Performance Monitoring

Collect and assess report cards at the end of each term.

Sponsor Communication

Encourage beneficiaries to write thank you letters to sponsors each term.



Micro-Credit Project Introduction

Purpose

Boost economic empowerment in Atiak sub-county, supported by Rotary Club.

Structure

Work with Village Savings and Loan's Associations (VSLA) of 20-30 members.

Activities

Weekly savings, affordable loans, and repayments within local communities.

Impact

Supported 20 groups, disbursed 25,000 USD as revolving funds since 2022.

Micro-Credit Project Process

Identification

1 Find registered VSLA groups with government authorities.

Training

Educate groups on loan methodology and necessary information.

Loan Approval

Review submitted requests and approve loans.

Disbursement

Provide approved loans to groups at 10% per annum for one year.



Micro-Credit Project Monitoring



Monthly Repayments

Groups make regular repayments for the agreed duration.



Activity Monitoring

AAA staff monitor economic activities implemented with borrowed funds.



Reporting

Provide accountability reports to partners, including Rotary Club.





Project Impact and Future

Child Sponsorship Beneficiaries	Over 1000
Current Sponsored Children	115
Micro-Credit Groups Supported	20
Micro-Credit Funds Disbursed	25,000 USD

Both projects continue to make significant impacts on education and economic empowerment in Uganda.
